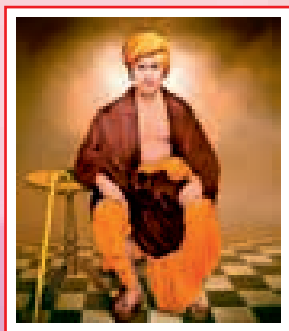

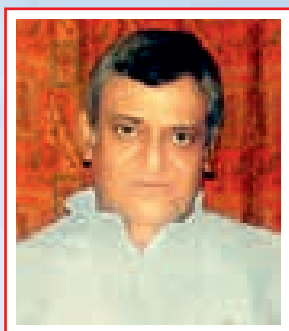

- To impart quality education to help students in developing proficiency and abilities which will further inculcate self-confidence, decision making power & leadership qualities in them.

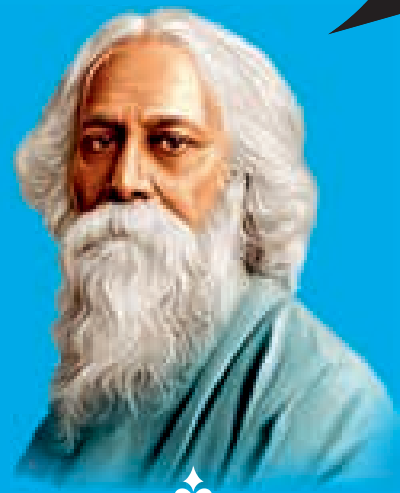
भारत का राष्ट्रगीत

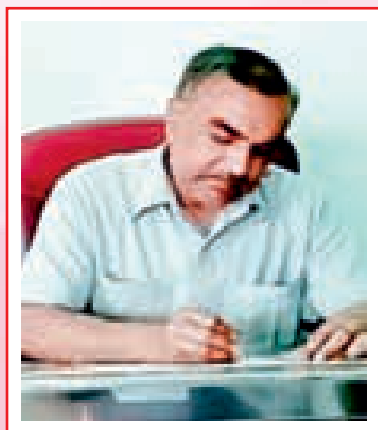

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ABOUT THE COLLEGE

- Inspiration provided by the pre-independence reformatory movement under the auspices of the Arya Samaj led to the establishment of *Dayanand Shiksha Sansthan*, Kanpur as a nodal body that was mandated to transform the landscape of widely prevalent illiteracy to resurging India and DBS(P.G.) College, Dehradun, was one of the outcomes of these cherished ideals.
- DBS(PG) College is affiliated with HNB Garhwal University [formerly a state university, upgraded to a central university in 2009] for the education of humanities, social sciences, and sciences. Its affiliation to Sri Dev Suman Uttarakhand University caters to the affiliation of some professional courses e.g., Microbiology, Biotechnology, Biochemistry, and Library sciences. The college fully complies with the rules and regulations of affiliating universities to give the highest priority to students' interests.
- Admissions are provided from undergraduate [with honours] to postgraduate level. College also offers a unique opportunity to carry out Ph.D. and post-doctoral work. College charges a fee as per the rules of the State Government and the University, which is far less than private institutions located in town.
- This college has a very inclusive teaching learning environment. College does not discriminate students on the basis of caste, creed, religion, gender, or region. College campus is a ragging free campus. Zero cases of ragging have been reported till now.
- College teams regularly participate in girls and boys' university sports events and other games activities. Students regularly participate in in-house and outhouse cultural and literary activities with distinction.
- Large number of PG students are getting summer training/internships/facility to work in institutions for their dissertations in reputed institutions like WIHG, ONGC, IIRS, FRI, DEAL, IIP, SGRR University, DES Uttarakhand, different departments of the State Government *etc.*
- Seminars /Symposiums/Training/Workshops are held regularly to enhance skills of students and faculty members
- Students can also participate in literary activities through the college magazine 'Vigyanda', College quarterly bulletin 'DBS Speaks', IKS wall magazine 'Anvīkṣā'.
- Students can join NCC, NSS, Rovers, Rangers, Cultural Group, Sports Groups, Various Students Clubs and participate in various activities throughout the year.
- College has signed MoUs with various organizations of National repute.
- College has received ISO 9001: 2015 certification on Quality Management Systems, Environmental Management Systems and also Occupational Health and Safety Management Systems

RULES FOR ADMISSION FOR ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26

The college will follow rules and regulations as framed by the HNB Garhwal University[A Central University] and orders of the Government of Uttarakhand for admission.

- 1. College Provides reservation of seats to candidates of eligible categories as per quota fixed by the Government of Uttarakhand. At present 19%, 4%, and 14% of seats are reserved for SC, ST, and OBC categories, respectively. There is also a provision for horizontal reservation of 30%, 5%, 4%, and 2% for Uttarakhand women, Ex-defence personnel, physically handicapped, and dependents of freedom fighters, respectively.**

The reserved seats are available to candidates having a domicile certificate of Uttarakhand only.

- 2. In the case of OBC, candidates are required to produce a non-creamy layer certificate issued not before July 1, 2022.**
- 3. For regular courses, 90% of seats in the college are reserved for candidates of Uttarakhand and 10% for other states.**
- 4. 10% reservation of EWS category will be permissible only after increasing the seats in each class by the Government of Uttarakhand and the University. The college cannot do any admission in this category without the order of the Government of Uttarakhand and the University**
5. The fractional rounding shall not be admissible for calculating the minimum eligibility criteria i.e. 44.9% or 39.9% shall not be treated as 45% or 40%.
6. The candidates belonging to SC/ST category shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility criteria or minimum cut-off.
7. Students who have passed plus two examinations from the Open School with five Subjects will also be eligible for admission in undergraduate classes and will have to submit TC/CC of the last organization (regular) & also TC cum migration of open board.
8. ACC from class I Gazetted officer is required for gap year students and open board students.

9. If the CUET Score of two candidates is the same, then the eligibility criterion for admission will be the average percentage of 12th class and if the 12th percentage of both candidates is the same, admission will be based on the date of birth.
10. Applicants who might have appeared in the Compartment/Supplementary Examination may apply for admission. However, such applicants shall be considered for admission, subject to their clearing the Compartment/ supplementary Examination, only if they had submitted their admission forms well in time and if their final result might have been declared before preparing the final merit list for admission.
11. For gap year, the candidate has to produce an affidavit while seeking admission in a higher class.
12. Every candidate is required to submit an undertaking before the admission committee signed by their guardian in the prescribed form stating that they would not indulge in ragging.
13. Students of other states will have to submit police verification from the place where he or she last completed regular study.
14. The multiple entry-exit system is available for the students under NEP system from 2025-26.
15. Applicants will not be granted admission to the same class as might have been passed by them even with a change in Subject(s) studies. This means, that a student who has passed B.Sc./BA. will not be granted admission to B.Sc./ BA with a different combination of subjects and an applicant who may have passed M.Sc./M.A. in one subject will not be granted admission to M.Sc./M.A. in another subject. [as per old system]
16. The candidate, who have been detained or failed in a class or dropped out, shall not be granted regular admission. Such candidate can appear as year back students in the university examination.
17. Applicants who have been punished for adopting unfair means at an examination or have been convicted by a court

- Of law for a crime committed by them or have been expelled/rusticated by the Colleges/University or have been found to be guilty of indulging in ragging in the institution(s) attended by them, prior to seeking admission to the college, shall not be granted admission
18. Students indulging in activities in the Campus considered to be improper, or unwarranted, or amounting to breach of discipline, or a violation of the Rules and Regulations of the College in the opinion of the Administration/Proctorial Board shall be liable for being expelled/rusticated, or at least being denied admission in the next Academic Session.
 19. Candidates seeking admission are advised to contact the admission-in-charge of respective admission committee for proper information. No excuse will be accepted for ignorance and misunderstanding about requirements.
 20. Admission of Kashmiri Migrants: The concessions will be provided to the Kashmiri migrants as per the direction of the State Government. 21. Admission rules for foreign students: The rules will be same as adopted by the affiliating university. The details regarding eligibility criteria and admission guidelines are available on the website www.hnbg.ac.in.
 22. It is made clear that in MSc Chemistry there is specialization in ORGANIC CHEMISTRY. Students seeking admission in MSc Chemistry will have to submit an affidavit that they will not apply for transfer of their admission after IInd semester to pursue their studies in Physical or Inorganic Chemistry in other colleges.

➤ Weightage Point for Admission in UG/PG Classes

Students seeking admission to the programmes /courses of the College shall be given weightage for participation in co-curricular activities to be restricted to a maximum of 5% in accordance with the details specified below:

- (a) NSS B-Certificate or 240 hours + two special camps-1; NSS C certificate- 2 participation in National Integration Camp / Republic Day Parade-3 (maximum 3 in all);
- (b) NCC B-Certificate-1; NCC C-Certificate-2; Participation in Republic Day Parade (national)- 3; NCC Cadet of the State / National Awardee- 3 (maximum 3 in all);
- (c) Students selected under Youth Festival organized by AIU-Zonal = 2, National 3 maximum 3 in all);
- (d) Participation in sports events organized by AIU-Zonal 3, National 5 (maximum 5 in all);
- (e) Position secured in national competitions organized by AIU or the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs-Individual = First-4, second-3 and third-2; and, team = first-3, second-2 and third-1 (maximum 4 in all);
- (f) Participation in national level literacy/cultural/quiz competitions- individual = first-4, second- 3 and third-2; and, team = first-3, second- 2 and third-1 (maximum 4 in all).

Note - Maximum Weightage 5 Points in any Category

Note:

In compliance of an interim order of Hon'ble High Court of Uttarakhand dated 11-04-14 in WP (PIL) No. 164 of 2013, the Government of Uttarakhand vide order no. 152 (1) XXIV (N)/ 2014 dated 11 June 2014 and H.N.B. Garhwal University vide its order No. ACD/429/14 dated 06/06/2014 have directed the colleges to grant admission strictly within the sanctioned limit and on the basis of merit.

General Instruction for filling Online Merit/Admission Form for Registration

Please follow the following instructions:

- For admission in B.Sc. Ist & B.A. Ist attach scanned copies of mark sheet of qualifying examination, (+12), photo, Aadhar card and certificates if you are claiming any weightage points. **CUET SCORE CARD is mandatory for 2025 as per University guidelines** [Students are advised to check the mapping of subjects for eligibility in the University Website] College will follow direction of the H.N.B.G.U. for Admission.
- For admission in M.Sc. I and M.A. I attach scanned copy of mark sheets of B.Sc. /B.A. Ist, IInd & IIIrd years/all semesters, photo and certificates if you are claiming any weightage points. **University Entrance Exam is mandatory for 2025 as per University guidelines. [Please check eligibility as per University rules before applying]**
- For admission in reserve category, attach copy of caste certificate issued by concerned Tehsil. The reservation policy of State Government of Uttarakhand will be followed for admission. (OBC Certificate not before than July 2022)
- For photo and candidate's signature, image should not be larger than 5 KB and for other documents 500 KB.
- Students are advised to fill separate Merit form for each group in science subject. All students seeking admission in BA and BSc I semester are required to fulfill the eligibility condition as per CUET which is available in the subject mapping uploaded in the University website. The college can provide relaxation only on the basis of directives from the University.
- Students should not disclose their password and user ID but keep it with them safely.
- Once last date for e filling form is over, college soon declares merit list of candidates that also includes names of few waitlisted applicants in order of merit.
- Students are advised to check online display of list of shortlisted candidates for admission.

Note |: The admission of a student can be cancelled at any time by the Principal in case it is noticed that the student had given wrong information, concealed the facts or admission has been made against the norms.

Instruction for Submission of Merit / Admission Form To the Admission Committee for Admission

Merit listed candidate may get admission on satisfaction of the Admission Committee after counselling and submission of all documents in hard form.

A candidate has to:

- Be present in person before the Admission Committee for physical verification of documents.
- Produce all the required documents in original before the Admission Committee.
- A candidate has to produce downloaded copy of the Admission / Merit form along with a Undertaking for Curbing the Menace of Ragging (Anti ragging) and Anti drugged duly signed by the candidate and parents.

- A candidate has to attach Original Transfer Certificate (TC) and Character Certificate (CC) from the institution last attended.
- A candidate has to attach photocopies of the qualifying examination, High School (Date of birth) Certificate. Photocopies of other documents claimed to earn weightage points, Caste Certificate (wherever applicable)
- Attach a copy of CUET Score card for UG admission and the score of University Entrance exam for PG admission.
- Attach an affidavit for gap year in case the candidate has a gap in the last qualifying exam and the class in which seeking admission.
- Students will have to deposit fee on the same day of admission. If, due to some unavoidable reasons fee can not be deposited, then the Convener of the admission committee should be informed in writing, seeking permission. Otherwise, the seat may be allotted to the next candidate seeking admission.
- A copy of the fee payment receipt generated after online payment has to be submitted to the Admission Committee

SOME OTHER IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- No applicant shall be admitted to any course / programme offered by the College after the expiry of the notified last date for admissions. The said last date of admission shall not be extended even if all the available seats in a given course/programme may not have been filled and some seats might be vacant after the expiry of the last date of admission.
- All SMS from the college regarding college admission will be sent to the applicant's registered mobile number [Number filled up during online registration]. The college will not be responsible for change in the candidate's mobile number and non receipt of SMS.
- Candidates are strictly required to note the last date of admission of candidates in a particular merit list.
- Fees to be strictly submitted within the stipulated date. Admission may be cancelled by the admission committee if fee is not submitted within the stipulated date and the candidate will have no claim for admission in future.
- It is mandatory for a student to have college I- Card. A student of DBS PG College must have his/her I Card while entering the college campus. Contact the I- Card section positively after 10/15 days for I- Card after your admission process is over.

FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUP) [w.e.f. ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26]

The following course descriptions, course structure, and other relevant information will apply exclusively to students enrolling in undergraduate programmes for the first time in the Academic Session 2025–26:

Descriptions related to the Contents

(a) Credit

The number of credits assigned to a course reflects the minimum time commitment required by a student in the form of lectures, tutorials, and practical sessions. As per the standard academic structure:

- One credit is equivalent to one hour of classroom teaching per week, or
- Two hours of practical/tutorial work per week.

Each semester shall comprise a minimum of 20 credits. To successfully complete a semester, a student must earn the required credits by passing the prescribed examinations and fulfilling course requirements.

Selection of Major and Minor Subjects (FYUP in Arts/Science)

(b) Major Course

In the first semester, students are required to select one Major and one Minor subject preferably from the same broad subject group. However, in cases where this is not feasible—either due to the student's preference or institutional constraints—students may opt their Minor subject from a different group. This flexibility shall be exercised within the framework of broad subject groups as defined by the University.

From the **second semester** onward, students will continue with three subjects: one Major, one Minor, and one Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject.

Major: The Major discipline represents the principal area of academic specialization within a degree programme. The degree shall be conferred in this discipline. The student must attain a minimum of 50% of total credits in a discipline to earn an undergraduate degree with a major in that discipline. The Major consists of a well-defined set of courses aimed at building comprehensive knowledge and competence in the subject. It includes both Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses, **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses** and **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** related to the core subject. To earn a degree with a major, students must meet the minimum credit requirements specified for different program categories.

Level of Courses offered under Major Category in different years of FYUP

Major courses in the first two semesters (I & II) will be Introductory level courses, in the next two semesters of FYUP, i.e., (III & IV Semesters) they will be of Intermediate-level. Further in the third year of FYUP, i.e., (V & VI semesters), they will be higher-level courses. In the fourth year of FYUP, i.e., (VII & VIII semesters), the Major courses offered will be higher-level courses or Advanced-level courses or a combination of both levels of courses. The following are the different categories of Major courses to be offered under FYUP:

Core Course/Discipline Specific Core Course (Major): These are mandatory courses associated with the Major discipline that every student must complete. They provide foundational and advanced knowledge essential to the core subject.

Core Elective Course/Discipline Specific Elective Course (Major): These are optional/elective courses within the Major discipline, offered as a pool of subject-specific papers. Students are given the flexibility to select courses based on their academic interests or career goals, allowing for a degree of customization within the Major framework.

Core-Specific Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses are directly aligned with the core discipline(s) chosen by the student under the FYUP. Core-specific. The skill courses aim to enhance the skills of the students based on the core courses opted by them under the FYUP. These are specialized skill-based courses aligned with the core subjects offered by the departments. Additional skill-oriented courses will also be provided under various categories. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are further available as part of the Minor Course offerings.

SEC are also offered as AMSC (Additional Multidisciplinary Skill Courses) in the Second Year of FYUP.

Vocational Course/Field Visit/Internship: Vocational courses are designed to equip students with industry-relevant skills through specialized training tailored to the needs of entrepreneurs, businesses, and industries. The objective is to ensure that graduates are employment-ready and possess the practical competencies demanded by the job market. Internships further enhance this by offering students the opportunity to work in professional environments where they can apply their classroom learning, develop workplace skills, build industry connections, and gain insights into career pathways. In addition to providing students with practical, experience-based learning, fieldwork/field visit aims to expose them to real-world socio-economic and societal challenges, allowing them to bridge the gap between theory and practice and develop effective solutions to real-life problems.

Project Report: The Project Report course under NEP 2020 aims to cultivate research aptitude, analytical thinking, and academic writing skills among students. It provides hands-on experience in identifying problems, collecting data, and presenting findings systematically. This experiential learning component enhances subject-specific understanding, promotes interdisciplinary approaches, and prepares students for research-based higher education or professional roles in diverse fields.

(c) Minor Course

A Minor discipline provides students with an opportunity to broaden their knowledge and skills beyond their major discipline. The Minor courses include discipline-specific courses, skill courses, community outreach-based courses and multi-disciplinary/inter-disciplinary (MD/ID) courses in the FYUP. A minimum of 32 credits will be offered under Minor Courses in a four-year undergraduate programme, while a minimum of 24 credits will be offered in a three-year undergraduate programme. Students must earn these credits through approved Minor Courses. However, to obtain a degree with a Minor in a particular subject/discipline, students must also fulfil the minimum credit requirements specified for their respective programme categories.

(c.1) Discipline Specific Minor: The Discipline Specific Minor courses include a selection of courses from a specific discipline, opted by a student, that meet the credit requirements for the minor. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) will also be offered under the minor courses.

Community Outreach: The curricular component of 'Community Outreach' will involve activities that would expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems.

Level of Courses offered under Discipline Specific Minor Category in different years of FYUP

Discipline Specific Minor courses in the first two semesters (I & II) will be Introductory level courses, in the next two semesters (III & IV Semesters) they will be of Intermediate-level. Further, if offered/opted in the third year (V & VI semesters)

they will be higher-level courses. In the fourth year, the Discipline Specific Minor courses offered will be higher-level courses or advanced-level courses or a combination of both level of courses.

(c.2) Additional Courses-ID/ MD Courses (Minor): In addition to discipline-specific minors, students enrolled in Undergraduate (UG) programmes will also have the opportunity to pursue additional minor courses, categorized as Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) courses.

In case of ID/MD courses, the students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class or equivalent grade level). The College will follow university guidelines in ID/MD for allocation of subjects.

Note:

1. Students shall have the option to continue pursuing the same additional course (Interdisciplinary or Multidisciplinary) as minor course in the VII and VIII semesters of the FYUP.

Value Addition Course (VAC)

These are the courses which are apart from any discipline related courses and aims to add value to the overall personality and development of an individual while focusing on areas such as Connecting to Environment and Community, Understanding and Connecting with Environment; Culture, Traditions and Moral Values, etc. It is compulsory to study all these Value-Added Courses as offered by the University in different semesters.

(d) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

These courses aim to enhance the different capabilities and abilities of the students which will help them grow in very field of life and will help in their holistic development. Indian, Modern Language, Indian Knowledge System and Communication Skills are the courses offered under the AEC. Some of the courses offered under the AEC category are designed to strengthen students' skill sets and may also be classified as Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), depending on their content and learning outcomes. Communication Skills, Indian Knowledge System and other such courses enhancing the different skillsets of the students will also be categorised under Skill Enhancement Courses.

Language Courses: Under the Indian and Modern Languages Course category, students are offered language courses designed to help them learn new languages of their choice. A pool of languages will be made available, from which students may choose to study one language in each semester and another in a subsequent semester, each carrying 2 credits.

***Three Year Bachelor's Degree (Multidisciplinary Programme) (In case of Exit under FYUP) w.e.f 2025-26**

Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (As an exit option after VI Semester under FYUP) A student who opts to exit the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) after successfully completing six semesters shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree with a Major in one subject, provided she/he have earned a minimum of 64 credits in the major discipline out of a total of 128 academic credits. These credits must be earned from any of the multidisciplinary undergraduate programmes offered.

In the case of a student enrolled in the FYUP with two core subjects, she/he shall be eligible for a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree with a Single Major, provided she/he have earned at least 64 credits in one Core subject (from Arts or Science

disciplines). These 64 credits must be accrued through Discipline-Specific Core (DSC)/Core Courses (CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE), and other related courses in the chosen major subject.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENT

a) Attendance Rules

It is mandatory for a student of a Course / Programme of the University to put in 75% attendance in all classes including Lectures, Tutorials, and Practical's (wherever applicable) in respect of each subject/paper separately. Students failing in meeting aforesaid minimum attendance criteria shall not be permitted to appear in the internal /sessional Examination for the course being pursued during the academic session concerned.

Candidates are hereby informed that their attendance is reported to the Chief Minister's Office, Uttarakhand, regularly.

b) University Examination and Promotions

From 2018 onwards university examination fee is deposited online in the university account along with the filing of the online examination form. A copy of both will have to be submitted to the college office for further action.

The university examination schedule and rules of promotions as prescribed by the HNB Garhwal Central University will be applicable. Students are required to fill online university examination forms and fees and deposit their hard copies in the college office as per the schedule of the university.

Internal Assessment (Sessional) There will be two sessional tests/internal assessments and one end semester examination for PG Students and one sessional test and one end-semester examination for UG students.

For PG students 40% of the total marks in each paper will be reserved for internal assessment and 30% for UG students. Similarly, there will be one sessional for each practical of the same weightage. Students shall compulsorily attend the sessional tests. The sessional test as part of the continuous internal assessment shall be conducted and evaluated by the teacher offering the course.

For UG Students

Candidate who put in 75% attendance in I and II semester separately but fails to acquire 20 credits in UG I and II semester together shall not be promoted to the III semester, in that case he/she shall cease to be a regular student.

A candidate who thus having ceased to be a regular student, acquires the minimum number of credits for promotion to III semester, shall re-register himself/herself as a regular student for appearing at the examination of III semester.

Provided that a regular candidate who have fulfilled the minimum attendance requirement, fails to secure the required number of credits for promotion to the III semester, may apply for re-registration as a regular student in the I or/and II semester. He/She shall have to fulfill the attendance requirement afresh and shall again perform sessional work and practical and shall appear in the End Semester Examination of all the courses at the next examination of I and II semesters. Any marks obtained in the immediately preceding year and the attendance being disregarded. Similarly a regular candidate who having fulfilled the minimum attendance requirement, fails to secure the required number of credits for attaining degree, may apply for re registration as a regular student in III and/or IV semester. (S)he shall have to fulfill the attendance requirement afresh and shall again perform sessional work and practical and shall appear in the End Semester Examination of all the courses at the next examination of III and IV semesters. Any marks obtained in the immediately preceding year and the attendance being disregarded. However, no candidate shall be permitted to continue as a regular student for more than two times in any semester.

For PG Students

The criteria are the same as mentioned above for UG Students. A candidate who puts in 75% attendance in the I and II semesters separately but fails to acquire 18 credits in the I and II semesters taken together shall not be promoted to the III semester

Scholarship for Higher Education (SHE) offered by the Department of Science & Technology aims to enhance rates of attachment of talented youth to undertake higher education in science intensive programmes, by providing scholarships and mentorship. This scheme offers 12000 scholarships every year @ Rs. 80,000/- each, for under-taking Bachelor's and Masters level education in the Natural & Basic sciences, possessing the following criteria:

Students who happen to be among the top 1% in 12th standard at their respective Board Examinations and are pursuing courses in Natural and Basic sciences at the B.Sc. level

To ensure timely disbursement of Scholarships to students on a common portal for various Scholarships schemes and to Avoid duplication in processing, Government of India developed National Scholarships Portal under the National e-Governance Plan which aims at providing common electronic portal for implementing various Scholarships schemes launched by Union Government, State Government and Union Territories across the country. OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Student Aid Fund (College Level)

Partial or full fee concessions may be granted to economically weak students. Application for fee concession must be submitted on the prescribed form obtainable from the college office, duly supported by an income certificate issued by the competent authority. The application completed in all respects must be submitted to the college office, latest by the end of August in the year.

Fee concession granted is subject to good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies and may be withdrawn any time if a student is found neglecting any of these.

All forms will be available from the college office free of cost. In addition to the above concessions, ad-hoc grants may be given from "Student Aid Fund". Students desiring to avail this aid must contact the Dean Students Welfare.

Students are encouraged to apply for scholarships offered by the organizations where their parents are working. Viz. ONGC, Army, Banks etc.

Post matric scholarship for Minorities

Scholarship will be awarded to the minority students who have secured not less than 50% marks in the previous final examination and annual income of their parents/guardian from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2.00 lakh.

Uttarakhand Post Matric Scholarship

Eligible SC/ST, OBC, EBC Students should submit their scholarship form for the academic year for processing scholarship to SC/ST, OBC, EBC each year via National Scholarships Portal . Students applying for these scholarships are advised to contact college scholarship convenor Dr.. Vipin Chanalia, Assistant Professor in Geology before filling the online application or Mr. Mahesh Kumar in the college office.

CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students are encouraged to join one of the following:

National Service Scheme [NSS]

There are three vibrant units (two girls and one boy) of NSS under the control of three Programme Officers. Students of undergraduate classes are registered as volunteers for these units.

National Cadet Corps [NCC]

(NCC) NCC Training is imparted to our boys and girls students by separate units. Both units are working under State Directorate of Uttarakhand with its controlling units 29 UK BN and 11 UK BN. Male and female students of undergraduate classes may join NCC. Further information regarding seats etc. may be obtained from the concerned ANOs.

Rovers and Rangers

Rover and Rangers units are imparting training to college students in different personality development traits. The units are working under Bharat Scouts and Guides organization. Students should contact the Rover and Ranger Leaders for registration etc.

Sports

The College has an independent department of Physical Education, looked after by a Faculty to promote sports and games. Basketball and Volleyball courts, Table-Tennis hall, playground for Cricket, Football, Kabbadi and Hockey are available along with other basic facilities for sports.

The college organizes time to time University Athletics Meet, Cricket Tournament, Boxing Tournament etc. Books on various sports and games are available to participants in the Physical Education Department. College is also recipient of different grants from the Department of Sports, MHRD, Govt. of India for development of sports related infrastructure in college.

Cultural Activities

To hone the cultural talent of the students, the college has a cultural committee which invites talented singers, dancers, instrumentalist, Dramatist etc. The students participate in Inter collegiate University Meet at Srinagar and other places as well under the supervision of the committee.

Literary activities

To enhance the talents and capabilities of students, the college regularly organizes debate competitions, essay writing competitions, poetry writing competitions, discussion on literature in various languages. Starting of E-Newsletter, organizing expert talks, organizing quizzes, starting students Literary Club are in the pipeline.

Namami Gange Cell

The main purpose of the cell is conservation of river Ganga, reducing pollution in the banks of the river, understanding the importance of the river for sustainable development of the nation and also understand the spiritual value of the river through the wisdom of Indian knowledge System. This cell will organize awareness campaigns, seminars, debates, poster competitions, rallies, *Shram Dan* etc for achieving the goal through the participation of students. NEP students enrolling in this cell for CCS have to devote 30 hours in any one semester to avail the certificate from the Cell as per NEP degree requirement.

Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Cell

The purpose of this cell is to showcase the rich culture and tradition of India through culture, customs, traditions and to celebrate the Unity in Diversity of our Nation through various cultural and literary activities, fairs, festivals. NEP students enrolling in this cell for CCS have to devote 30 hours in any one semester to avail the certificate from the Cell as per NEP degree requirement.

Swachh Bharat Cell

The Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is the most significant cleanliness campaign of Government of India. To have largest participation, students of higher educational institutes can also join the programme. This cell will enrol students other than students enrolled in NCC, NSS, Rovers and Rangers and facilitate in awareness campaign, discussions, debates, Shram Dan for a clean campus, clean neighbourhood, clean city which will have a spillover effect for clean State and clean Nation. NEP students enrolling in this cell for CCS have to devote 30 hours in any one semester to avail the certificate from the Cell as per NEP degree requirement.

Indian Knowledge System Cell

The college has initiated a separate cell from 2022-23 to inculcate the rich Indian Knowledge System among the youth generation. For enrichment of the youth, to preserve the rich knowledge system that India carries, to explore the vast treasures of Indian Languages, Philosophy, Yoga, Astrology, Drama, Music, Polity, Grammar, Medicine, Architecture etc, this cell has been established. Students from any stream can register in the cell and explore the vast treasures of wisdom of ancient Indian Knowledge through various workshops, talks, seminars, documentary /film screening, wall magazines, students clubs etc. For 3rd Semester BA students and 4th semester BSc students enrolled under NEP, IKS is a 2 credit course also. Students are encouraged to join the IKS Students Club and the Srimadbhagwadgita Certificate Course.

Two Research Cells

1. Social Sciences and Humanities and 2. Science: The two separate research cells have been formed to promote quality and plagiarism free research among students and faculty members of the college. The cells also organize workshops, training programs, special lectures to promote quality research.

Other Cells/Associations /Committees

The college has a Parents Teachers Association and an Alumni Association. Keeping in view the importance of healthy interactions and establishing linkages with old students and families of our present students Alumni association and Parents Teacher association are working together for the progress of the student and the institution.

The Anti Tobacco Cell, the Anti Drug Cell, Anti Ragging Cell are very significant cells to maintain the overall discipline of the Institution along with the College Proctorial Board. To prevent any harassment against women inside the campus the college has a Cell for prevention of harassment against women. There is also a Women Grievance Cell in the college. The Women's Cell of the college is established in accordance with the directives of Honourable Supreme Court of India to ensure safety, security and dignity of women at workplace to create a congenial working environment which is free of sexual harassment or gender based discrimination for all women employees and students and to enhance awareness and sensitivity to this important issue amongst all concerned.

FACILITIES OFFERED

Library and Reading Room

Library & Reading Room facilities are open only to students and staff of the college. The College Library possesses an excellent collection of books. Journals/ periodicals. The library opens from 10 a.m. To 5 p.m. from Monday to Saturday. For lending purpose, the books are categorized into three sections: General Section, Reserved Section and Reference Section. Library has a magazine counter having prominent newspapers and magazines. There is a separate reading room for those students who are preparing for competitive exams. Graduate students may get maximum 3 books at a time from the central library.

Terms and conditions for Book issue

Before leaving the counter, the member should satisfy himself /herself that the book issued to him/her is in sound condition, and if not, he/she should immediately bring the matter to the notice of the Librarian otherwise he/she is liable to be held responsible for any loss/damage and would be required to replace it with a sound/fresh copy.

Periodicals, Directories, Encyclopaedias, which might be difficult to replace and other such work as may be declared reference books by the Librarian shall not be issued to the member students.

Members are not allowed to sub lend the books of the library. Students who return books later than the due date will be liable to pay a fine as decided by the college authorities from time to time.

Any infringement of the rules will deprive the member of the privilege of admission to and of borrowing books from the library.

Timings for issue and return of books

Books from General Section are issued and returned from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Books from Reference Section are only issued for consultation in the library against Identity Card from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

E Granthalaya

E Granthalaya a library automation software is working in full swing in the college. The students can access the e-catalog of the central college library, become members in E Granthalaya, and know the status of issue and return of books along with the number of copies available.

Laboratories

The College has well equipped and well managed laboratories for all the science courses offered, viz . Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Geology, Geography, Zoology, Microbiology and Biotechnology.

Central Instrumentation Centre

The CIC has instruments like UV -Visible Spectrophotometer, HPLC instrument and FTIR spectrometer, *etc.* Other instruments available in the laboratory are Laminar Air Flow, Autoclave, Incubator, Electrophoresis, Centrifuge, pH meter, and Magnetic Shaker, *etc.*

Laser Room & Dark Room

PG Physics practical are conducted in the Laser Laboratory. It is also used for research in MSc dissertation. Experiments related to Optics are carried out in the Dark Room

Materials Research Laboratory

MR laboratory has been set up from DST-SERB Grant under the SERB-TARE scheme. Research work and M.Sc. dissertation work are carried out in this lab.

GIS Laboratory

The college has a full-fledged GIS lab with various GIS software. Students of various disciplines having courses related to GIS and Remote sensing can work in the lab

Competitive Exam Cell

This cell helps the students to prepare for different competitive examinations. Counselling, organizing workshops, seminars, special talks, providing study materials, helping in career guidance, helping the learners who are unable to cope up with their classes, helping the slow learners *etc.*

Multifunctional Laboratory

The multifunctional lab at D.B.S. (P.G.) College is one of the advanced labs equipped with 21 computers, with the latest software, a server, flat screen monitor, overhead projector, a photocopier and e-podium. The lab can be used for beginners, intermediate and advanced learners. Area like personality development, social grooming, and basic knowledge of computers are also included in the lab curriculum. Various workshops and seminars with focus group gatherings are held in the Multifunctional Laboratory

Computer Laboratory

Well Equipped Computer Laboratory with internet facility is available in the college for the students. Students can visit and avail the facility as per their convenience and specified timing of the laboratory. However, it is mandatory to follow the rules set by the college for using the facility.

Bank

A full fledged branch, known as the DBS College Branch of Central Bank of India is working in the college premises. The students can open their account with Zero Balance.

Seminar Room

The Seminar Room of the College is the place for multifarious activities throughout the year. The activities in the seminar room range from curricular and cocurricular seminars, lectures, debates, discussions and literary society activities.

Golden Jubilee Auditorium

Large-scale events are held in the college auditorium - Swarn Jayanti Sabhagar which has a large stage and a seating capacity of about 200. Its stage is ideally suited for theatre activities, other group performances and also for national & international level seminars.

Canteen

Canteen facility for students is available in the college near parking area.

Gymnasium

A full-fledged gymnasium is available with modern equipment.

College Magazine 'Vigyanda'

College publishes annually magazine named "Vigyanda", with original contributions from bonafide students, teaching and non-teaching staff, along with progress reports of the departments and extra-curricular activities that mirroring the college.

Health Services

A doctor serves the college for two days in a week and in case of emergency one can visit his clinic. College maintains Dressing material, glucose and essential medicine in Emergency kits.

Railway Concession

Subject to general directions issued from time to time by the Railway Authorities, students of the College can avail Railway concession under the following provisions only:

- From their College to an Examination centre allotted by H.N.B. Garhwal University or vice versa.
- For going to their hometown (as mentioned in application form for admission) during long vacations approved by the railway authorities.

Note: the concession is not intended to apply to students attending an Examination or interview for the purpose of obtaining employment or seeking admission elsewhere e.g. P.M.T, Engineering Entrance etc.

Parking

Students should park their vehicles inside the college campus at the Parking. Parking vehicle in other places other than the reserved area is strictly prohibited and will be an offense. A financial penalty may be levied on the person concerned.

Student Union

Student union election will be as per state government order and / or university rules.

RIGHT TO INFORMATION ACT, 2005 (RTI, 2005)

The Right to Information Act 2005 provides effective access to information for citizens of India, which is under the control of the public authorities. It promotes transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority. For obtaining information under Right to Information Act, 2005 an application can be made to the Public Information Officer.

Salient Features

- The prescribed fee for filling the application is Rs. 10/- by way of cash against proper receipt or by way of bank demand Draft or bankers cheque or Indian Postal Order payable to the Principal D.B.S (PG) college, Dehradun.
- An appeal can be preferred before the 1st Appellate Authority against the decision of the Public Information Officer.
- Manuals prepared under Section 4(1)(b) of the Right to Information Act 2005 are available on the website of the college.

Refund of Caution Money/Security

Refund of caution money will start from September succeeding the close of the academic year in which the student was studying. It will be refunded to either the candidate concerned or it may be sent to his/her address with due deduction of bank/PO charges. In no case, it will be given to any other person and no authority letter will be entertained. If caution money is not claimed within one year after leaving college it shall be forfeited.

FEE RULES

1. The fee for all classes will be charged in a single installment at the time of admission through bank Challan duly signed by in-charge admission Committee. Cheques or Bank Drafts are not acceptable. Fee does not include examination fee that will be paid separately at the time of filling exam form to university.
A college student who couldn't appear for any valid reason in sessional examination will have to pay Rs. 150 /subject for appearing in leftover exam. before notified date.
2. Fee once paid is not refundable. However, if a student wants to cancel his /her admission within a fortnight from the date of admission the fee will be refunded after deducting a processing fee of Rs. 500/- for regular courses and Rs. 2000/- for professional courses.
3. A fee of Rs. 250/- will be charged, if a student seeks re-admission at UG level and 500/- at P.G. level respectively.
4. The students seeking admission in MA/M.Sc. IIIrd Semester have to fill fresh admission forms along with requisite fee after the end of MA/MSc IInd semester examination and similarly the students for BA/B.Sc III and V Semesters. Re-registration is compulsory to study in all even semesters i.e. II, IV and VI Semesters.
5. Ex-students desirous of attending the classes will have to pay Rs. 800/- for practical and Rs. 600/- theory Classes.
6. The outside students seeking admission in the college will have to deposit Rs. 500/- in addition to the fee prescribed for corresponding I Semester given in the table. Other college students appearing for any examination, theory or practical, approved by the university will have to deposit Rs. 200/ subject as DBS College fee besides university.
7. University examination fee : All bonafide students have to deposit university exam and other fees in university account directly before filling examination form online. A hard copy of fee receipt should be submitted to college office with hard copy of exam form.

8. At the time of admission, a research student will have to deposit a fee of Rs. 4900/- (Reg. Fee Rs. 1000+Non-Refundable Library Deposit Rs. 1000+Non-Refundable Security Deposit Rs. 500+Non-Refundable Annual Fee for first one year Rs. 2400/-) and after that Rs. 2400/- annually.
